

CHAPTER 200.

AN ACT to repeal An Act entitled "An Act to provide for the better protection of Partridges in Washington County," passed January Session, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, Chapter twenty-one, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Act entitled An Act to provide for the better protection of Partridges in Washington County, passed January Session, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, Chapter twenty-one, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows :

Repealed and re-enacted.

Sec. 2. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That no person or persons shall kill, shoot, or in any manner catch or wound any Partridge or Partridges in Washington County from the date of the passage of this Act, until the twentieth day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

Time to kill.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That any person or persons violating the preceding section, shall pay a fine of five dollars for each and every Partridge killed, shot, trapped, caught or wounded, in violation thereof, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace, one-half of which fine shall be paid to the County Commissioners of said county for the use of the Public Schools thereof, and the other half to the informer, and in default of the payment of such fine, the person convicted of violating the preceding section as aforesaid shall be committed to the county jail for thirty days, or until said fine and costs of prosecution be paid, whichever shall first occur.

Penalty.

How disposed of.

May commit.

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the operation of all Acts of Assembly in conflict with the provisions of the preceding section, be and the same are hereby suspended until the expiration of this Act.

If in conflict suspended.
