credit, bank bills and other promises to pay gold and silver coins, and may do all other acts customary in a general shipping, commercial, banking, warehousing and forwarding business; and the said Board of Directors shall have power to make and enforce all such by-laws, rules and regulations, and amend or annul the same at pleasure, and exercise all other rights, privileges and immunities as may be required for the proper management of the affairs of the said Company and to carry into effect the purposes of this act; pro-to law. vided the same be not contrary to the laws of this State or the United States.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That any officer, agent, clerk and other employee of the said Company, or any person who shall make fraudulent entries upon or in any of the books of this Company, or who shall, with intent to defraud, make or issue, or cause to be made or issued any account, order, warrant, receipt, certificate, bill of lading, or any other paper of writing, print, stamp, or who shall take or cause to be taken, make away with or in any manner conceal, with intent to misappropriate or defraud the said Company or any person of any money, goods, wares and merchandise, or any other property, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished in such manner as may be provided by the laws of this State, for feloniously stealing property of the value which Felon may have been taken, used, made away with, stealing. concealed for the purpose of taking, or in any other manner misappropriating with intent to defraud.
