AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend title of bill as follows : A supplement and amendment to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the People's Gas Company of Baltimore city, passed at January session, 1860, chapter 291, re-affirming said Act and authorizing said Company to receive real estate, stock, bonds, and other property in payment for subscriptions to the Capital Stock, and to make a payment for material and labor in the Capital Stock, creating the office of Vice President and providing for his election, decreasing the number of Directors in said Company to five, and amending the second section of said Act so that the capital may be increased "by" any amount not exceeding two millions of dollars, in place of "for any amount not exceeding said sum."

The amendment was read, and on motion of Mr. McLane, the further consideration thereof was postponed, and the bill, with proposed amendment, made the order of the day for Tuesday, 15th inst.
