

By-laws.      Sec. 8. *And be it enacted,* That the Directors of said Company shall have power to make and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations for the direction and management of said Company as may in their judgment be necessary for the purposes of their incorporation, not inconsistent with the provisions of this charter and the laws and Constitution of this State; and the President and Directors of said Company, or a majority of them, shall constitute, appoint and employ such officers, agents and servants for the construction, preservation and repair of said road, and for the receipt and collection of tolls, and the transaction of all other business of said Company, as in their judgment may be necessary.

Employ officers and ag'ts

Avoid paying toll.      Sec. 9. *And be it enacted,* That if any person or persons whatever, riding or driving anything whatever, or leading the same, shall therewith pass through any private gate or bar, or turn off said road with the intention of avoiding the payment of toll for passing through such gate, and all and every person so offending shall for every such offence forfeit and pay to the said President and Directors a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, to be sued for and recovered with costs of suit, before any Justice of the Peace, in like manner as debts of similar amount may be sued for and recovered; and if any toll-gatherer shall demand and knowingly receive any greater toll than he is authorized to receive by this Act, he shall forfeit ten dollars for every such offence for the use of the county in which the offence occurs.

Penalty for over charge.

Injure or impair.      Sec. 10. *And be it enacted,* That if any person or persons shall wilfully, by any means whatsoever, injure, impair or destroy any part of said road, or any of its necessary works and buildings, or place any obstructions on said road, or if any person or persons shall effect or attempt to effect an entrance through any toll gate on said road, by force, violence or intimidation, such person or persons so offending, shall be subject to indictment in the Circuit Court of the county in which the offence occurs, and upon conviction of such offences, shall be punished by fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.
