of said Commissioners in a book to be provided by them for that purpose, which shall at all times be open to the inspection of any person interested.

Sec. 15. And be it enacted, That the bailiff shall be appointed from among the citizens of said village qualified to vote for commissioners; provided, however, that the said Commissioners may appoint the constable of the election district in which said village is located, if he be a resident of said town. or will reside therein after his appointment; before entering upon the duties of his office he shall make oath before a Justice of the Peace for Caroline county, that he will faithfully and impartially perform the duties imposed upon him by this Article, and the by-laws and ordinances of said Commisssioners, and shall execute to the State of Maryland a bond, with two good and sufficient Give bond. surities, to be approved by the said Commissioners of said village, in such penalty as they shall prescribe, conditioned that he shall well and faithfully perform the duties of said office, in all things appertaining thereto, according to law, and shall well and truly collect and pay over to the treasurer of said village all taxes levied by the Commissioners, and all other sums of money that may be received by him for the use of said corporation.

Sec. 16. Be it enacted, That the treasurer shall be appointed from among the citizens of the said village qualified to vote for Commissioners, and before entering upon the duties of his office, he shall give bond to the State of Maryland, with two give bond. good and sufficient surities, to be approved by the said Commissioners, in such penalty as the said Commissioners shall prescribe, conditioned that he shall well and faithfully account for all moneys paid over to him by the bailiff of said village, or that may be received by him from any other person or persons for the use of said village, and shall Must pay over well and truly pay over to his successor in office, or to the order of the Commissioners of said village, signed by their clerk and countersigned by their president, and perform all other duties of his office according to law; he shall keep full and correct accounts of all moneys received by him, with the sources from which received, and the dates of such receipts, and of the disbursements made by him, with the time when the person to whom and on what account the same were made.
