

Leave was granted to the Harford delegation to introduce a bill to provide for the appointment of an additional Justice of the Peace for election district, No. 4, in Harford county.

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill relating to division fences in Baltimore county.

The report was adopted, the Committee discharged, and the petitions so referred.
