AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out sub-section "7," and insert the following in lieu thereof:

7. They shall, where any error has arisen by assessing property not liable to be assessed, rectify such error, and levy and pay to the proper party any money that may have been paid in consequence of such error; this section to apply also to the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court, of the City of Baltimore; and the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court of said city shall pass an order directed to the Register of said city, who shall pay thereupon to the proper party any money that may have been paid in consequence of such error.
