The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 149, 150, 151, 152, 153, 154, 155, 156 and 157, of the 3rd Article of the Public Local Laws, relating to roads in Baltimore county, and sub-sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, and section 3 of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, chapter 411, approved March 30, 1868, and re-enact the following sections in lieu thereof.
