Mr. Seibert presented the petition of J. A. Fisher and others for the repeal of an Act passed December session, 1832, chap. 45, so as to reopen an alley in Hagerstown.

Mr. Hopkins presented the petition of Thomas Lamplugh and 154 other citizens of the town of Havre de Grace, praying the passage of an Act prohibiting the sale of spirituous or malt liquors within the limits or within two miles of the limits of said town.

Mr. Lankford presented the petition of Robert H. McCready and 59 other citizens of Fawson's district, in Somerset county, asking for a prohibitory liquor law in said district,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lankford, Bratton and Dennis.

Mr. McLane presented the memorial of the National Board of Trade upon the subject of licenses.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Standish presented the following petitions:

The petition of Adam E. Hutchins and 19 other citizens of Allegany county, praying the Legislature not to amend the charter of the Consolidation Coal Company, and stating that they had signed petitions in favor of such amendments under a misapprehension of the facts.

Also,

The petition of George W. McCullough and 480 other citizens and property holders of Allegany county, praying the Legislature not to pass any amendment to the charter of the Consolidation Coal Company of Maryland.

Which were severally read and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Mr. McLane submitted the following order:

Ordered, That a Committee of three be appointed by the Speaker to make all needful and proper regulations for holding a joint session of the two Houses of the General Assembly, at the delivery of Mr. Wallis' eulogy on the late George Peabody, and that they report the same to this House.
