Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to authorize the Clerks of the Circuit Courts of this State, the Superior Court of Baltimore city, and the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of said city, to enter a judgment during recess of the Court, upon the production of a written agreement by the parties to a suit.

On motion of Mr. Baldwin, of Anne Arundel,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal section 13, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Landlord and Tenant," sub-title "Distress for Rent," and to re-enact the same with an amendment.

On motion of Mr. Baldwin, of Harford,

Leave was granted to a Select Committee on the Penitentiary to introduce a bill to encourage good behavior in the prisoners of the Maryland Penitentiary.

On motion of Mr. Winters,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to incorporate Worthington Valley Homestead and Baughman Valley Railroad Company.

On motion of Mr. Turner,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to incorporate the Baltimore Savings Loan and Trust Company.
