The Senate of Maryland immediately thereupon entered the Hall of the House of Delegates and took the seats assigned them upon the floor, along with the Governor and the Court of Appeals, who had preceded them.

Teackle Wallis, and conducted him to the Speaker's Chair; whereupon, the Speaker, as Chairman of the Joint Assembly, introduced Mr. Wallis, who proceeded to deliver his eulogy upon the life and character of the late George Peabody.
