Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to repeal an Act passed at the January session, 1868, chapter 334, entitled an Act supplemental and amendatory of an Act entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Cumberland and Pennsylvania Railroad Company, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
