Returning the thanks of the General Assembly to S. Teackle Wallis, Esq., for the delivery of his Oration on the Life and Character of the late George Peabody,

Endorsed "Passed by yeas and nays."

The bill entitled an Act to change the dividing line between the 1st and 8th election districts in Worcester county.

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. McLane,

The rules being suspended, it was
