Mr. Baldwin, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following amendment :

At the end of first section, add :

And such persons as are now, or may hereafter be, exempted by law.

Which was rejected.

Mr. Hardcastle, of Talbot, submitted the following amendment :

Amend section 6 by inserting after the word " Ordnance," in line 4, the words: Chief of Artillery.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Harrington submitted the following amendment :

Strike out, in section six, line two, the words, "two thousand," and insert fifteen hundred.

Which was read.
