We would suggest for the consideration of your Hon. Body the appointment of a Joint Committee of three members on the part of the Senate, and five on the part of the House, to visit the reformatory and beneficiary institutions of the State, located in the City of Baltimore and vicinity, including the State Normal School, and report thereon, and to this proposition, we respectfully ask the concurrence of your Hon. Body.
