Strike out the word "and," before the words, "be it enacted;" and after the word "enacted," insert the words: by the General Assembly of Maryland.

Strike out the figure "3," after the word "section," and insert the figure 2.

Amend the title by inserting after the word "protect," the words, minor operatives in; and between the words, "cotton" and "woolen," insert the word and, and strike out the words, "and other," before the word "factories."
