Mr. Blake submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the use of this Hall be granted to the House of Refuge Band, on Tuesday evening, March 15th, and that none be admitted to the Hall but members of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and those that may be furnished with tickets of admission by the Speaker.

Mr. Baldwin submitted the following amendment:

Strike out the word "Hall," after the word "the," and insert the words: floor of the House.
