Reported unfavorably upon the bill entitled an Act to provide free scholarships in the Burkettsville Female Seminary, and to prescribe the mode of appointing the beneficiaries.

The further consideration thereof was informally postponed.

Mr. Crawford, Chairman of the Committee on Currency, to whom had been referred the House bill entitled an Act to create State Banking Institutions, and to enable the several Banks in this State—State and National—to avail of the provisions thereof, reported favorably thereon with proposed amendments.

Mr. Wilmer, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to regulate the trial fees of the State's Attorney for Kent county.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Shipley, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to amend the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore County," by adding thereto the following additional sections in relation to swine running at large.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Streett, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay Wm. H. Morgan, Tax Collector for Harford county, for overpayment into the Treasury for the years 1862 and 1863.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Standish, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to ratify the action of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Cumberland, authorizing Jones' Alley to be closed.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Garey, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably, a bill entitled an Act to create an additional election district in Caroline county, to be styled District No. 6, or Andersontown district.
