A bill entitled an Act to amend the Act of January session, 1865, chapter 70, entitled an Act to authorize the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company to build a railroad from a point on the line of its road, within the State of Maryland, between Knoxville and the Monocacy Junction, through Frederick and Montgomery counties to the boundary of the District of Columbia, so as to make a direct connection with the City of Washington, by amending and re-enacting the fourth section of said Act.
