

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,
March 15, 1870.

Gentlemen of the Senate :

We have the pleasure of informing your Honorable Body that we are in receipt of a communication from his Excellency, the Governor of the State, informing us that the Commissioners of Fisheries of the State of New York have accepted the invitation to address the General Assembly, and will arrive in this city on Wednesday next, and will appear before the Legislature on that day, at such hour as the Senate and House may appoint. And we propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, to refer the subject to the Joint Special Committee of the two Houses appointed to request the Governor to invite these gentlemen to address the General Assembly, and they be authorized and directed to make suitable arrangements for the occasion.
