

tice shall decree a forfeiture of the canoe, boat or vessel, together with all the tackle and apparel, and order the same to be sold by the officer making the arrest, who shall sell the same on five days' notice, to the highest bidder, subject to an appeal to the Circuit Court for Calvert county, and after the payment of all the expenses attending the arrest and prosecution of the suit, he shall retain one-fourth of the balance himself, distributing one-fourth among the parties assisting in making the arrest, and pay over the remaining one-half to the school fund of the county, to be used in the repair of old, and the erection of new public school houses.
