The bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Carroll county, to indemnify William Shaw for the destruction of his property in the City of Westminster, by a mob, in April, 1865, and to levy a sum of money for the payment of such indemnity,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to fund the floating debt of the city to an amount not exceeding eight hundred thousand dollars,

The bill entitled an Act to change the name and style of the Trustees of the Central School in Frederick county, and to repeal the Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Trustees of the Central School, in Frederick county, and re-enact the same with amendments,

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

Mr. Markland, Chairman of the Select Committee on Wild Fowl, to whom was referred the bill entitled an Act to add additional sections to Article 98, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, relating to Wild Fowl, reported back the same with proposed amendments.
