

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend, by inserting the following after section 26 :

section 27. *And be it enacted*, That for the first election to be held under this Act, on the first Monday in May next, J. E. Unkerfer is hereby appointed Judge of the same in ward No. 1, and Daniel Sweadner Judge in ward No. 2, and these Judges shall give at least ten days' notice prior to said election; shall keep the polls open on said first day of May, from 1 o'clock, P. M., to 4 o'clock, P. M.; shall appoint a clerk for each poll, to keep a record of all persons voting and all persons voted for, and shall notify the persons elected, Burgess and Commissioners of their election, and the latter shall immediately enter upon their duties as provided for by this Act. The Judges and Clerk shall each receive one dollar for their services, to be paid by the Burgess and Commissioners.

Section 27. Amend by changing 27 to 28.
