The Secretary of the Senate returned

The Senate bill entitled an Act to transfer the sum of money appropriated by chapter 383, section 1, Acts of General Assembly of 1870, to the Elkton and Massey's Railroad Company, from said Company to the Middletown and Elkton Railroad Company,

The proposition of the Senate was non-concurred in.
