Being upon a third reading,

Mr. Cooper submitted the following amendment :

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 31, line 13, after the word "licenses," insert the words, "except that Marine Insurance Companies shall pay of such excess only one-tenth of one-half per cent.
