The bill entitled an Act to enable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to provide for laying out and opening North Avenue, between York Avenue and Bel Air Avenue.

Which was read a first time and referred to a Select Committee, consisting of Messrs. Chaisty, C. R. Hamilton and T. H. Hamilton.

The bill entitled an Act to provide for cancelling the stocks or bonds of the State of Maryland now held by the Treasurer to the credit of the sinking fund, and to provide for the investment of the augmentations of said fund.

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendments."

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Section 4, line 8, strike out the words "the Treasury," and insert in lieu thereof, "the place where made payable."

Section 4, line 8, strike out all after the word "giving," to the word "the," in line 12, and insert in lieu thereof, the words "not less than thirty days notice to the holder of such overdue debt, that on a day named in said notice."

Section 5, line 4, insert after the word "certificate," the words "maturing at some future day."
