

may be entered into, and that the contract or contracts for building the said Court House and offices and furnishing the same, shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder; and the said County Commissioners are hereby, authorized to sell and dispose of such material of the Court House destroyed by fire as may not be required or used in erecting the building aforesaid, and the proceeds arising therefrom, shall be a part of the Court House Fund, and appropriated to the building of the said Court House.
