EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, Annapolis, April 1, 1872.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

I return to the House, in which it originated, a bill entitled an Act to repeal sub-section 1, of section 173, of Article IV., of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-titled "Courts," as the said sub-section 1 was adopted by the Act of 1870, chapter 177, entitled an Act to change the jurisdiction of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City," and reapportion and enlarge the jurisdiction of the Baltimore City Court, the Superior Court of Baltimore City, and the Court of Common Pleas, as provided by section 39, of Article IV., of the Constitution, and to re-enact the same as amended, without my signature.
