STATE OF MARYLAND, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, ANNAPOLIS CITY, July 12, 1871.

Proclamation by the Governor:

Whereas, the Constitution of the State of Maryland, Article

III, Section 4 and Section 5, provides as follows:

"Section 4. As soon as may be after the taking and publishing the next National Census, or after the enumeration of the population of this State under the authority thereof, there shall be an apportionment of Representatives in the House of Delegates, to be made on the following basis, to wit: Each of the several Counties of the State having a population of eighteen thousand souls or less shall be entitled to two Delegates, and every County having a population of over eighteen thousand and less than twenty-eight thousand souls shall be entitled to three Delegates, and every County hav-
