Ordered, That fifteen hundred copies of the Governor's Message and accompanying documents be printed in English, and five hundred copies of the same in the German language, for the use of the Senate, the price for the same to be fixed by the Committee on Printing, subject to the approval of the Senate.

Which was read, and, by unanimous consent of the Senate, was withdrawn.
