Mr. Spates, from the Committee on Corporations, to which leave had been granted, reported a bill, entitled a Supplement to an Act to incorporate the Lutheran Congregation of St. Paul's, Christ's Lutheran Church, St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, and Mt. Zion's Lutheran Church, in Frederick County, passed December Session, 1849, chapter 310.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Claggett, from a Select Committee, to which leave had been granted, reported a bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 2 of chapter 274, entitled "An Act to repeal section 2 of chapter 31 of the Acts of Assembly of 1865, in relation to the publication of Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments," and to amend and re-enact the same.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Claggett moved to suspend the rules, so as to give the bill a second reading,
