Said bill was read the second time.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to continue in force an Act entitled an Act to regulate the fees of Constables, passed January Session, 1865, chapter LXVII,

Being upon its second reading,

Mr. Stephenson offered the following amendment:

Section 1, line 7—Strike out all after the word “the,” and insert, General Assembly shall repeal or modify the same.

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was then read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
