JOINT RESOLUTIONS:

WHEREAS, The bars and impediments in the Patuxent river, in this State, are annually becoming greater, and will soon seriously affect the important trade on said river; be it

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That our Senators in Congress are instructed, and our Representatives requested, to use all proper means to induce Congress to make an appropriation to deepen the Patuxent river, and place buoys on the bars and shoals of said river, from Benedict to the head of steamboat navigation.

Resolved, That a copy of this preamble and resolution be furnished by his Excellency, the Governor, to each of the Senators and Representatives in Congress from the State of Maryland.
