Was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill, entitled an Act to amend and re-enact section 3, of Article V., of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Appeals,"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 11, of Article LXXXVIII, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Sheriffs," and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed or a third reading.

Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal, amend and re-enact section 114, of Article XCIII., of the Code of Public General Laws," title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Debts," as amended and re-enacted by chapter 142, of January Session, 1862,

Being upon its second reading,

Mr. Williams offered the following amendment:

Amend by adding at the end of section —, "*Provided, however,* that the statute of limitation shall again commence to run on said claims from the date of the recording of the same, as aforesaid."

Which was adopted.
