July 2, 1861, entitled an Act donating public lands to the several States and Territories, which may provide Colleges for the benefit of agriculture and the mechanics' arts.

Leave was granted to Messrs. Earle, Williams and Dennis to report a bill to repeal Article LXXXVII., of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Sheep," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Senate bill, entitled an Act to add a new section to Article-X., of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Attachments,"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill, entitled an Act to prevent incompetent persons from conducting the business of pharmaceutists or retail druggists,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrosed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to add new sections to Article V. of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Calvert County," sub-title "County Commissioners,"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to pay M. A. Newell a sum of money,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act for the relief of creditors of the late William M. Dealys, who was an insolvent debtor at one time, and who died without heirs,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The House bill, entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller to audit and settle the claim of Mary C. Roberts,

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as-follows:
