

In conclusion, your Committee feel that they have discharged their duties to the best of their ability; and, after the thorough examination they have given these important State institutions, and critically scrutinized the conduct of those entrusted with their care and management, they are prepared to bear witness to their usefulness, their good government, and the necessity of the fostering care and benefaction of the State. We, therefore, recommend the usual annual appropriation of \$15,000 for its support.
