Said resolutions were then sent to the House of Delegates.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 87, Article LXXXV., of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Pleadings, Practice and Process," and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to authorize Wm. P. Cade, of Caroline county, for and on behalf of his children minors, and Wm. A. R. Griffith, of said county, to exchange deeds of conveyance,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 16, of Article XXXVIII., of the Code of Public General Laws, so far as the same relates to Talbot county, and to add an additional section to Article XX., Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County,"

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to prohibit the granting of licenses for the sale of spirituous liquors at or near Emory Grove Camp Ground, in Baltimore county,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 882, of Article IV., of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the city of Baltimore, and to re-enact the same,
