Said bill was then read the second time.

Also, from the same Committee, reported favorably,

The Senate bill, eutitled an Act to add a new section to Article LVI., of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Licenses.

Which was read the first time.

Also, from the same Committee, to which leave had been granted,

Reported a bill, entitled an Act to incorporate the Real Estate Bank of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Tuck, from the Committee on Judicial Proceeding, to which had been referred

The House bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 2, of Article LXIV., of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Mortgages, and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Reported said bill with the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add at the end of the bill,

"Nor to any mortgages given by Brewers to Malters, to secure the payment to the latter, of debts contracted by the former, for malt and other materials used in the making of malt liquors."
