The bill, entitled an Act to provide for a supply of water in the town of Hagerstown.

Mr. Henry, from a Select Committee, to which leave had been granted, reported

A bill, entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Dorchester County to subscribe to the capital stock of the Vienna Railroad Company.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance, to which leave had been granted, reported

A bill, entitled an Act to pay Wm. Knabe & Co. a sum of money for a Piano furnished to the Governor's Mansion.

Which was read the first time.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following bills:

The House bill, entitled an Act to refund to G. W. Oldham, of Cecil county, a sum of money erroneously paid into the Treasury.
