The Treasurer shall make monthly returns under oath to the County Commissioners of all taxes and other moneys received by him, and at least once in every two months, or oftener, if they deem expedient, the Commissioners shall make a dividend *pro rata* or otherwise, in their discretion, among those holding claims against the county of the money in hand, or of so much as they may deem expedient to distribute; *provided*, that jurors' and witnesses' certificates shall be paid in full; and also the road expenses, whenever the Supervisors' accounts may be adjusted; and the Commissioners shall, when requested, issue certificates of indebtedness to creditors of the county, which may be transferred, and afterwards paid as aforesaid to the holders thereof, but certificates shall not be issued except for the amount due, after deducting such credits as the county may be entitled to.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the day of its passage.

Amend the title, so as to read as follows: "A bill, entitled an Act to provide for the appointment of a Treasurer of Anne Arundel county, and to amend and re-enact sections 82, 83, 84 and 195, of Article II., of the Code of Public Local Laws for said county."
