not the design of said supplementary act to grant, without full and fair compensation to your petitioner whose interests were damaged, and business interfered with and destroyed.

Your petitioner, therefore, prays your Honorable House, to so amend, alter, repeal or annul the said Act of incorporation of the Broadway and Locust Point Steam Ferry Company of Maryland, and the said supplementary act thereto, that the privileges of which your petitioner has been deprived thereby, and the ruinous damage and loss which he has sustained therefrom, may be secured again to him in common with all or any other Company or corporation, so that he may be enabled to carry on the business in which his means, his energies, and his time have been invested, devoted, and expended, on an equal footing with this favored Company, and to the advantage, accommodation and benefit of the community.

And your petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
