

The House bill, entitled an Act to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors, or any other article of traffic within two miles of any festival or pic-nic held for the benefit of Churches.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Timmons, Carroll and Miller.

The House bill, entitled an Act to repeal chapter 182, of the Act passed at January Session, 1870, relating to Militia.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Militia.

The House bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 45, Article XXVIII., of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," sub-title "Private Roads," and to enact the following in lieu thereof.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

The House bill, entitled an Act to authorize and require the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, to record such Chancery and Injunction Cases decided in said Court, as involve title to land, and to which have not been heretofore recorded.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Davis, Steiner and Downs.

The House bill, entitled an Act for the protection of the Chancery Records of Baltimore City,

Was read the first time and referred to the Baltimore City Senators.

The House bill, entitled an Act to exempt the Second Elect-district of Baltimore county from the operation of chapter 265, of Public Local Laws, passed January Session, 1870, relating to swine running at large.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Davis, Steiner and Downs.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to relieve the sureties of Charles Parker, of Worcester county.
