The bill, as amended, was then read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day,

The House proceeded to the consideration of the bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 2 of Article LXIV. of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to mortgages, and to reenact the same with amendments.

The question recurring upon the amendment submitted by Mr. Bowie, to the amendment submitted by Mr. Banks, on the 25th instant:

"Provided, That nothing in this Act shall apply to Baltimore and Prince George's counties,"

Pending which,

Mr. Bowie moved that the further consideration thereof be postponed, and the bill made the order of the day for Tuesday next, the 6th of February,

Pending which,

Mr. Bowie moved that the House do now take a recess until 5 o'clock this P. M., decided in the negative.

Mr. Streett moved that the House do now adjourn.
