The Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 2, of chapter 274, entitled an Act to repeal section 2, of chapter 31, of the Acts of Assembly of 1865, in relation to the publication of Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to amend and re-enact the same.
