Mr. Staylor submitted the following order:

Ordered, That a Special Committee of three be appointed to confer with his Excellency the Governor, on the expediency of offering a reward for discovery of the incendiary in the case of the ice-boat Maryland.

Mr. McCosker submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates, February 1, 1872.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose, with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, to appoint a Joint Special Committee of three from the House and two from the Senate, to inquire into the cause of the disasters to the ice-boats Chesapeake and Maryland, and whether such disasters are to be attributed to incompetency on the part of the management of said boats, or negligence on the part of the officers and crews of said boats.
