SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 6.

AN ACT to repeal certain sections of, and amend the charter of the Old Town Savings Institution of Baltimore, as contained in an Act entitled "an Act to incorporate the Old Town Savings Institution of Baltimore," passed at January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, and to repeal an Act passed at January session, eighteen hundred and sixty, entitled "an Act to amend an Act to incorporate the Old Town Savings Institution of Baltimore," passed at January session, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, and re-enact parts of the same with amendments; and to change the name of said body corporate to the Old Town Bank of Baltimore.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections three, four, five, six, eight, Sections repealed.
