

CHAPTER 100.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claim of William T. Markland and Brother for rebuilding State Tobacco Warehouse in Baltimore city, as per contract made with the Commissioner of Labor and Agriculture.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury ^{Comptroller} be and he is hereby requested and directed, to issue his warrant ^{to issue war-} upon the Treasurer to pay William T. Markland and Brother, six thousand six hundred and ten dollars, the balance due them for rebuilding State Tobacco Warehouse, No. 2, in Baltimore city, as per contract made with the Commissioner of Labor and Agriculture.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take ^{In force.} effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 101.

AN ACT to repeal section eighteen of article fifty-six of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licences," sub-title "Fisheries and Horse Races," and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section eighteen of article fifty-six of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licences," sub-title "Fisheries and Horse Races," ^{Repealed.} be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted ^{Re-enacted.} so as to read as follows:
