CHAPTER 202.

AN ACT to enable the Revd. Richard Fuller, of Baltimore, to convey certain effects and property by his last will and testament.

Permission to convey property.

SEC. 1. *Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Rev. Richard Fuller of Baltimore, is permitted to convey by his last will and testament, to the Eutaw Place Baptist Church of Baltimore, a [a] residuary portion of the property and estate of which he may die possessed; the said legacy or devise to be used for the purpose of erecting a chapel or place of worship in the City of Baltimore.

In force.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
