John T. Sasseer, for the sum of twenty-seven dollars and twenty-five cents; for Thomas E. Berry, for the sum of forty-six dollars and twenty-five cents; for John T. Berry, for the sum of six dollars; for the estate of Levi Osbourn, for the sum of thirty-nine dollars; for Sarah H. Talburtt, the sum of fortythree dollars; for Stephen Belt, the sum of ten dollars and fifty cents; for William F. Berry, for the sum of thirteen dollars and fifty cents; for Dennis Duvall, the sum of ten dollars; for Charles Cheston, for the sum of fourteen dollars; for William B. Bowie, for the sum of sixty-one dollars and seventyfive cents; for Thomas H. Osbourn, the sum of thirty-one dollars and fifty-cents; for Trueman, Belt and Sons, the sum of six hundred and seventy-nine dollars and eighty cents; for Caleb C. Magruder, the sum of forty-three dollars and fifty cents; for John W. Burroughs, the sum of nine dollars; for William W. Hill, the sum of fifteen dollars; for Thomas R. Brooks, the sum of nine dollars; for Robert W. W. Bowie, the sum of three dollars; for Robert Bowie, the sum of four dollars and fifty cents; the whole amount being the sum of two thousand, eight hundred and fourteen dollars and eighty cents, for moneys erroneously paid by them to Inspectors of Tobacco in Baltimore city; said sums to be paid out of any moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, standing to the credit of the Tobacco fund.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take In force effect from the date of its passage.
