

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to add to Article LI. of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Justices of the Peace," sections under the head of "Criminal Jurisdiction," extending and regulating the criminal jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace.

Mr. Stone, Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, to whom was referred,

The bill, entitled an Act for the relief of the sureties on the bonds of Stephen R. Gore, late Collector of county taxes in Carroll county,

Reported back the same, and asked to be discharged from the further consideration thereof.

The Committee was discharged.

The Speaker laid before the House the report of the Commissioner of Immigration.
